

GERONTOLOGY
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The Minor Program in Gerontology (18 credits)

Christopher Newport University offers a multi-disciplinary minor in gerontology for undergraduates. The program is designed to meet the following student goals:

1. Provide a body of knowledge about older persons combined with skills obtained from the student's major discipline to prepare for careers in nursing home administration, administrative positions in community aging programs, research and planning, recreation, social work, counseling, adult education, and others.
2. Serve as a minor for the student who has no career goals in the field but has an interest in gerontology. Any of the courses may be taken without commitment to the entire program.

Program Requirements:

All courses must be approved by the Director prior to enrollment.

1. A minimum of 18 credits of course work, as listed below are needed to complete the minor.
2. Core requirements: BIOL 234; PSYC 340; SOCL 305; and select one of the following: SOCL 491, SOWK 401, or approved substitute;
3. Select two approved electives (6 credit hours).
4. Students wishing to use other courses as gerontology electives must have the advance written approval of the Director of Gerontology. Students using listed elective courses for the program in gerontology will be expected to do assignments within the courses to focus on the study of the elderly.
